EVERYBODY'S DOING IT!

There are now **more than 500 smokefree casinos and gambling venues** in the US thanks largely to local and state smokefree laws.¹

Twenty-one states, along with Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin Islands, have laws in effect that require state-regulated gambling to be **100% smokefree indoors.** This includes many of the U.S.'s hottest gaming expansion markets such as Maryland, Ohio, Massachusetts, and New York.²

A total of **4,411 municipalities** in the United States have laws in effect that restrict where smoking is allowed.³

Our capital city neighbors in Mississippi and Texas are 100% smoke-free.⁴

ALL New Orleans bars and gaming facilities are now 100% smoke-free!5

WHAT ABOUT SMOKING SECTIONS & VENTILATION?

The 2010 U.S. Surgeon General's Report, How Tobacco Smoke Causes Disease, verifies that there is no risk-free level of exposure to secondhand smoke and that ventilation cannot eliminate exposure of nonsmokers to secondhand smoke.

The Board of Directors for the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating, and Air Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE), the international standard-setting body for indoor air quality, unanimously adopted an important position statement on secondhand tobacco smoke at its Summer 2005 conference in June. This ASHRAE statement reaffirms:

- There is no safe level of exposure to secondhand smoke.
- Ventilation and other air filtration technologies cannot eliminate all the health risks caused by secondhand smoke exposure.
- Tobacco smoke does not belong in indoor areas.

The science is well established that smoking sections, smoking rooms, and even sophisticated casino ventilation and air cleaning systems **do not address the health hazards of secondhand smoke**.
